Revelation 2:12–17 (NASB95)

¹²And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write: The One who has the sharp two-edged sword says this:

¹³I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is; and you hold fast My name, and did not deny My faith even in the days of Antipas, My witness, My faithful one, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells.

¹⁴But I have a few things against you, because you have there some who hold the teaching of Balaam, who kept teaching Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols and to commit acts of immorality.

Numbers 25:1–3 (NASB95)

¹While Israel remained at Shittim, the people began to play the harlot with the daughters of Moab.

²For they invited the people to the sacrifices of their gods, and the people ate and bowed down to their gods.

³So Israel joined themselves to Baal of Peor, and the LORD was angry against Israel.

Numbers 25:4–9 (AMP)

⁴And the Lord said to Moses, Take all the leaders or chiefs of the people, and hang them before the Lord in the sun [after killing them], that the fierce anger of the Lord may turn away from Israel.

⁵And Moses said to the judges of Israel, Each one of you slay his men who joined themselves to Baal of Peor.

⁶And behold, one of the Israelites came and brought to his brethren a Midianite woman in the sight of Moses and of all the congregation of Israel while they were weeping at the door of the Tent of Meeting [over the divine judgment and the punishment].

⁷And when Phinehas son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the priest, saw it, he rose up from the midst of the congregation and took a spear in his hand

⁸And went after the man of Israel into the inner room and thrust both of them through, the man of Israel and the woman through her body. Then the [smiting] plague was stayed from the Israelites.

⁹Nevertheless those who died in the [smiting] plague were 24,000.

James 4:4 (NASB95)

⁴You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

¹⁵So you also have some who in the same way hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans.

¹⁶Therefore repent; or else I am coming to you quickly, and I will make war against them with the sword of My mouth.

Hebrews 4:12–13 (NASB95)

¹²For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

¹³And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do.

¹⁷He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, to him I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white

stone, and a new name written on the stone which no one knows but he who receives it.'

1 John 2:19 (NASB95)

¹⁹They went out from us, but they were not really of us; for if they had been of us, they would have remained with us; but they went out, so that it would be shown that they all are not of us.

Exodus 16:31–35 (NASB95)

³¹The house of Israel named it manna, and it was like coriander seed, white, and its taste was like wafers with honey.

³²Then Moses said, "This is what the LORD has commanded, 'Let an omerful of it be kept throughout your generations, that they may see the bread that I fed you in the wilderness, when I brought you out of the land of Egypt.' "

³³Moses said to Aaron, "Take a jar and put an omerful of manna in it, and place it before the LORD to be kept throughout your generations."

³⁵The sons of Israel ate the manna forty years, until they came to an inhabited land; they ate the manna until they came to the border of the land of Canaan.
